How can you help your child at home?

- Practise half termly spellings.
- You can visit your local library together with your child to find out information about the Stone age and the Digestive system.
- Don't forget to look out for books written by our Class Outhor, Roald Dahl. We have been reading Charlie and the Chocolate factory together in class and the children have absolutely loved it!
- Maths fluency is equally as important as reading and writing! Out the end of Year 4, your child will be taking part in a 'Multiplication Tables Check' Please practise all of your multiplication facts up to and including 12 x 12 Please encourage the use of TT Rockstars. You should be able to access this at any time with your individual logins.
- Support your child to complete their homework and spelling words each week.
