What can you do at home?

- Reading is key to enable children to flourish. Read their school reading book at home for at least 20 minutes every day.
- Children will be rewarded with 2 Dojos every time that they have read Please remember to date and sign the diary to confirm that reading has taken place.
- It would really help if you could ask questions about the content of your child's reading text eg. Where? Who? Why? Describe a certain character or setting?
- Practise half termly spellings regularly.
- Practise rapid recall of times table facts with your child and encourage the use of Times Tables Rock Stars.

Please provide your child with a water bottle filled with water <u>only</u> every day. Children can refill their bottles with fresh water when required

All snacks should be in your child's tray at the start of each day. Snacks can be fruit, toast or oatcakes.
