And what I say to you I say to all: Stay awake!"

Mark 13:33 - 37

This Sunday is the start of Advent. During Advent we think about God loving us so much that he sends his only Son. Advent is a time of preparing. We prepare our homes for the arrival of Jesus at Christmas, but we must also prepare our hearts. What things can you do as a family to prepare your heart?

In Sunday's Gospel, Jesus tells us to always be ready. We should make sure our hearts are always ready to receive Jesus.

During Advent, we light candles each week. The first candle that we light is the candle of Hope, which is also known as the candle of Prophecy. The candle reminds us of the hope we have in God that He will fulfil the promises set out in the Old Testament, that a Messiah would come and save the world.

After a number of years of no Christmas Fayre, we will be back! Our Christmas Fayre will take place on **Friday 8th December** after school.


