Sunday's Gospel

A reading from the Gospel according to St Mark

The beginning of the Good News about Jesus Christ, the Son of God. It is written in the book of the prophet Isaiah: 'Look, I am going to send my messenger before you; He will prepare your way. A voice cries in the wilderness: Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight.'

And so it was that John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. All Judaea and all the people of Jerusalem made their way to him, and as they were baptised by him in the river Jordan they confessed their sins.

John wore a garment of camel-skin, and he lived on locusts and wild honey. In the course of his preaching he said, "Someone is following me, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to kneel down and undo the strap of His sandals. I have baptised you with water, but He will baptise you with the Holy Spirit."

Mark 1:1 - 8

This Sunday's Gospel comes at the very beginning of Mark's Gospel. We hear from John the Baptist who tells others of Jesus's coming and just how powerful He will be.

This Sunday, we light the second candle; the candle of Peace. This week pray for peace in our world.

On Friday 15th December, the whole school will be visiting The Regent Theatre to watch the pantomime. Children will leave school after having their lunch. Early Years and Key Stage 1 children will travel to the theatre by bus and Key Stage 2 children will walk to the theatre – please ensure children are dressed for the weather. All children should bring their water bottle to school and will be given an ice-cream during the performance (dietary requirements will be catered for). The children are due to return to school by 4:15pm.



Christmas Week

During the last week of term, we will have our Christmas Week. This is a lovely week that we spend with the children in that magical time of Christmas.

On Tuesday 19th December, we celebrate Christmas Eve. We ask that the children come to school in their pyjamas. We will watch a film together and spend the day getting ready for Christmas Day.

On Wednesday 20th December, we celebrate Christmas Day. Children come to school in their school uniform as normal. We ask that all children go to the school hall in the morning so that we can celebrate Christmas day together. We will hopefully have had a visit from a special someone too. We will also have our Nativity Service in the afternoon, which will be led by Early Years and Key Stage 2. All are welcome to attend this, but families are reminded that this is a church service and therefore no photos or videos are allowed. You will be given a reverence guide on entry and we ask that you follow this.

On Thursday 21st December, we celebrate New Year's Eve with parties during the afternoon. Children come to school in school uniform. We are asking families to pay £1 per child on Scopay to help pay for party food.

Funding for 2 year olds

The Department for Education have requested that we share the following information:

From 2 January 2024, eligible working parents can apply for 15 hours of childcare for their two-year-old. Parents have until 31 March 2024 to apply for a code, with mid-January to the end of February being the optimum time to apply in case they need to provide further information to support their application.

To apply for a childcare code each parent needs to be working and earning the equivalent of 16 hours a week at national minimum/living wage and under £100,000 adjusted net income per year. This means that each parent needs to earn from just over £8,600 per year to be eligible for 15 hours a week of childcare during term time.

There is more information on the childcare support available to parents on the <u>Childcare Choices</u> website, where they can explore the early education entitlements and other government help with childcare costs.

This does not mean that we will be accepting 2 year olds, but to make you aware of the possible funding available.

Year 5 Inspire Morning

On Monday 18th December, we are giving Year 5 parents the opportunity to spend time with their child in the classroom, finding out more about the curriculum. There will be lots of fun activities planned and this is a fantastic opportunity for you to spend quality time with your child. If you would like to come along, there is no need to book a place, just turn up. We hope to see you there!

Disco

Foundation Stage/Key Stage 1 Disco

- Parents/Guardians of all children in Foundation Stage to remain with their child. Please only one parent per child. Key Stage 1 parents DO NOT need to stay.
- Please do not block the fire exits.
- If it is necessary to bring a child who is in Key Stage 2, then these should sit in the Year 6 classroom until 7pm and will then need to be supervised by a parent before the start of the Key Stage 2 disco at 7:15pm.
- As we are so tight for space, no prams should be brought into the hall.
- Any parents remaining with their child are responsible for their child's behaviour.
- Children should not leave the hall at the end of the night without their Parent/Guardian.

Only children attending St George and St Martin can attend the Disco. This includes younger siblings. Younger siblings cannot run around the dance floor.

Key Stage 2 Disco

- Children will not be supervised by staff before 7:15pm
- Parents should leave their child once they have registered.
- Children should not leave the hall at the end of the night without their Parent/Guardian.
- Mobile phones are not allowed in the disco
- Only children attending St George and St Martin can attend the Disco
