Sunday's Gospel

A reading from the Gospel according to St John

A man came, sent by God. His name was John. He came as a witness, as a witness to speak for the light, so that everyone might believe through him. He was not the light, only a witness to speak for the light.

This is how John appeared as a witness. When the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, "Who are you?" he not only declared, but he declared quite openly, "I am not the Christ." "Well then," they asked, "are you Elijah?" "I am not," he said. "Are you the Prophet?" He answered, "No." So they said to him, "Who are you? We must take back an answer to those who sent us. What have you to say about yourself?" So John said, "I am, as Isaiah prophesied: A voice that cries in the wilderness: Make a straight way for the Lord.""

Now these men had been sent by the Pharisees, and they put this further question to him,

"Why are you baptising if you are not the Christ, and not Elijah, and not the prophet?" John replied, "I baptise with water; but there stands among you – unknown to you – the one who is coming after me; and I am not fit to undo His sandal-strap." This happened at Bethany, on the far side of the Jordan, where John was baptising.

The Gospel of the Lord

John 1: 6 – 8, 19 - 28

In this Sunday's Gospel, we hear of John the Baptist. John was the son of Mary's cousin, Elizabeth and her husband Zechariah. Elizabeth and Zechariah were getting older and thought that they were unable to have children, but God sent them John. John had a special job to do as he would prepare people for the coming of Jesus. He encouraged people to repent and baptised them in the River Jordan.

This Sunday, we light the third candle, the candle of Joy. This candle is pink and reminds us that although we are preparing for the coming of Jesus during Advent, He IS coming and we should be joyful for that.

Year of Prayer

In 2025 we celebrate a Jubilee Year of the Church. To prepare for this special occasion, Pope Francis has dedicated the year of 2024 to the Year of Prayer. Throughout the year, we will be sharing prayers with children, supporting them in prayer and teaching them ways to pray. We would love for you to share in this too. When we share the prayers of the month, say them as a family. Prayers can be simple and said at any time. Prayers can be to ask God for help, to thank God, to ask for forgives. They can be for ourselves, our friends, our family, people from around the world.

Foundation Stage/Key Stage 1 Disco

- Parents/Guardians of all children in **Foundation Stage** to remain with their child. **Please only one parent per child**. **Key Stage 1 parents DO NOT need to stay.**
- Please do not block the fire exits.
- If it is necessary to bring a child who is in Key Stage 2, then these should sit in the Year 6 classroom until 7pm and will then need to be supervised by a parent before the start of the Key Stage 2 disco at 7:15pm.
- As we are so tight for space, no prams should be brought into the hall.
- Any parents remaining with their child are responsible for their child's behaviour.
- Children should not leave the hall at the end of the night without their Parent/Guardian.

Only children attending St George and St Martin can attend the Disco. This includes younger siblings. Younger siblings cannot run around the dance floor.

Key Stage 2 Disco

- Children will not be supervised by staff before 7:15pm
- Parents should leave their child once they have registered.
- Children should not leave the hall at the end of the night without their Parent/Guardian.
- Mobile phones are not allowed in the disco
- Only children attending St George and St Martin can attend the Disco

Reminders

Funding for 2 year olds

The Department for Education have requested that we share the following information:

From 2 January 2024, eligible working parents can apply for 15 hours of childcare for their two-year-old. Parents have until 31 March 2024 to apply for a code, with mid-January to the end of February being the optimum time to apply in case they need to provide further information to support their application.

To apply for a childcare code each parent needs to be working and earning the equivalent of 16 hours a week at national minimum/living wage and under £100,000 adjusted net income per year. This means that each parent needs to earn from just over £8,600 per year to be eligible for 15 hours a week of childcare during term time.

There is more information on the childcare support available to parents on the <u>Childcare Choices</u> website, where they can explore the early education entitlements and other government help with childcare costs.

This does not mean that we will be accepting 2 year olds, but to make you aware of the possible funding available.

Uniform Reminders

As we are coming into the colder months, please ensure your child has outdoor PE kit – navy joggers, and navy hoody (this DOES NOT have to be branded). Children cannot wear their burgundy school jumpers and cardigans for PE.

A reminder that girls should be wearing white socks or grey tights. Black socks and tights are not part of our school uniform.

All Key Stage 2 children should either have a clip-on tie, or a 'proper' tie. Key Stage 2 children cannot wear an elastic tie.

Dougie Mac Toy Collection

Dougie Mac have asked us to do 'Bring a Toy' to school. This doesn't have to be a new toy, it can be a toy or book that your child no longer uses that can then be taken to one of the Dougie Mac charity shops and sold on. Not only does this raise money for Dougie Mac, but it also stops toys ending up in landfill and so helps towards us looking after our planet. The ladies also said that old clothing could also be brought. Please only donate items that are in good condition and can be used again.

Please bring any items in from Monday 11th December. The last day for donations is Wednesday 20th December.
