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What can you do at home?

Read books and visit the library together so the children will develop an interest in reading and develop good comprehension skills.

Where possible, encourage your child to sit at table and use a knife and fork. To aid the fine motor skills and running of lunchtime in school

Encourage your child to practice writing their name (First and surname), CVC words using Phase 2 and Phase 3 sounds

It is so important to read with your child at home. We ask that you help your child with their reading book (and or words) at least 3 times a week and sign their reading diary <u>each</u> time.

Encourage your child to look for numbers in the environment e.g. house numbers, car number plates, etc. Do encourage correct number formation.

Encourage your child to begin to use the vocabulary involved in adding and subtracting; add, plus, subtract, take away, minus. How many left? How many altogether?

Practise your buttons and zips

Please don't forget that if you have any questions or concerns you are more than welcome to speak to me any time, just email or phone the school office

If you would like to talk to me in private, you are more than welcome to come into the classroom to discuss any matter arising

Just a reminder.....
