How can you help your child at home?

- It is so important to read with your child at home. We ask that you help your child with their reading <u>daily</u> and <u>sign their reading diary each time.</u>
- Practise spellings with your child at home. These are given out termly, but we encourage the children to practise them weekly. Support your child to use their spellings to write simple sentences, using their phonics sounds.
- Encourage <u>independence</u> with weekly homework in order for your child to make continued progress.
 - Encourage your child to memorise number bonds: 0+10=10, 1+9=10, 2+8=10, 3+7=10, 4+6=10. 5+5=10 10+0=10, 9+1=10, 8+2=10, 7+3=10, 6+4+10 and use the correct number formation.
- Encourage your child to count to 100 and develop an interest in numbers, counting in 2's, 5's and 10's.
- Keep practising for the Phonics Check.
- Support your child to complete any written work, using the correct letter formation.
- Read books and visit the library together with your child to foster a love for reading.
