What can you do at home?

- Oll children should be reading independently (or to an adult) for at least 20 minutes per day. Children should record all their reading in their diaries.
- Encourage children to practice all their times tables and related division facts and to recall them quickly.
- Encourage children to complete homework <u>promptly</u> and practice spellings regularly.


