Sunday's Gospel

A reading from the Gospel according to John

Just before the Jewish Passover, Jesus went up to Jerusalem, and in the Temple He found people selling cattle and sheep and pigeons, and the money-changers sitting at their counters there. Making a whip out of some cord, He drove them all out of the Temple, cattle and sheep as well, scattered the money-changers' coins, knocked their tables over and said to the pigeon-sellers, "Take all this out of here and stop turning my Father's house into a market." Then His disciples remembered the words of scripture: 'Zeal for your house will devour me'. The Jews intervened and said, "What sign can you show us to justify what you have done?" Jesus answered, "Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up." The Jews replied, "It has taken forty-six years to build this sanctuary: are you going to raise it up in three days?" But He was speaking of the sanctuary that was His body, and when Jesus rose from the dead, his disciples remembered that He had said this, and they believed the scripture and the words He had said. During his stay in Jerusalem for the Passover many believed in His name when they saw the signs that He gave, but Jesus knew them all and did not trust Himself to them; He never needed evidence about any man; He could tell what a man had in Him.

The Gospel of the Lord

John 2:13 - 25

In this Sunday's Gospel, we are in the third week of Lent and hear about Jesus driving the sellers out of the Temple. This is one of my favourite Gospel readings, because we hear Jesus become angry. He is angry at the sellers using His Father's house to trade. The Jews did not like this and questioned him. Jesus gave them an insight into his death and resurrection after three days, but they did not understand what this meant. This Gospel reading is one of my favourites, as we hear that Jesus gets angry. We often think of Jesus as someone who only ever shows those positive, caring emotions. In this reading, Jesus shows that he will not tolerate people using His Father's house as a market and this comes through as anger. We often use this reading as an example to the children that it is ok to feel a range of emotions, and that we learn to deal with these emotions.

This week, spend time as a family reflecting on the emotions you have felt this week. Why did you feel them? What were your actions? What could you have done differently?

Year of Prayer

In 2025 we celebrate a Jubilee Year of the Church. To prepare for this special occasion, Pope Francis has dedicated the year of 2024 to the Year of Prayer. Throughout the year, we will be sharing prayers with children, supporting them in prayer and teaching them ways to pray. We would love for you to share in this too. When we share the prayers of the month, say them as a family. Prayers can be simple and said at any time. Prayers can be to ask God for help, to thank God, to ask for forgiveness. They can be for ourselves, our friends, our family, people from around the world.

This year, we will share prayers with you each week that you can say as a family. This weeks' prayer is Prayer to the Guardian Angel:

Angel of God, my guardian dear,
to whom God's love commits me here,
ever this day be at my side,
to light and to guard,
to rule and guide.

The award, championed by overseas development charity CAFOD, was presented last week after they successfully planning and implementing faith inspired actions that highlighted the importance of caring for people and the planet. The actions have had a positive impact throughout the school, in our local community, and globally too, as we reached out to make a difference.



Missio

On Monday, the children in Reception to Year 6 will have an assembly relating to the work of Missio. Missio are a charity who share God's love by helping local missionaries to work alongside global communities that are poor or in need, regardless of their background or belief. Sometimes this need might be very specific: a motorbike for a Priest to celebrate Mass in remote villages; a simple community hall so people can gather together; vaccinations to protect vulnerable children. Whatever our missionaries need to help them share the joy of the Gospel, Missio strives to provide it.

Following the assembly, the children will come home with a sticker and bookmark to prompt you to ask them about the work of Missio. Over the next few weeks, each class will have a collection box where any loose change could be donated to Missio.
