Boys must wear grey socks


Girls must wear white socks or grey tights

# Places of Worship

As part of our RE curriculum, the children across the school learn about other faiths. Next term, the children in Key Stage 2 will be visiting the place of worship for the other faith that they are studying.

Our children in Year 4 will be visiting a synagogue on 16<sup>th</sup> April.

Our Year 3 children will be visiting a mosque, our Year 5 children will be visiting a Hindu temple and our Year 6 children will be visiting a Sikh gurdwara.

We feel that it is very important that our children visit these places of worship to gain a greater understanding of these different religions. We live in a multi-cultural city and a multi-cultural country. By having understanding, we build respect for other faiths.

# Holy Week

Sunday marks the start of Holy Week – the most Holy Week in the Church's year. The start of Holy Week is Palm Sunday, where Jesus was greeted by huge crowds as he entered Jerusalem. They were waving palm leaves and shouting 'Hosanna'. People were so excited to see Jesus – they knew how special this man was. This is in stark contrast to what was to come on Good Friday.

We enter the Easter Triduum on Thursday with Maundy Thursday. On this day, Jesus had the Passover meal with His closest friends. This is where He shared the bread and wine with his friends. He told them that this would become His Body and Blood; something that we repeat every time we go to Mass. Following the meal, Jesus went to pray in the Garden of Gethsemane. Here, he was arrested following Judas's betrayal.

Jesus was sentenced to death the following day, we know this day as Good Friday – which seems a very strange name for a day when Jesus died on the cross. However, this is a good day because this is the day that God sacrificed His only Son to save each one of us. Even in Jesus's final moments on the cross, he was able to forgive one of the men crucified alongside Him. Jesus is taken to the tomb.

When Jesus's friends go to the tomb on Sunday, they find the tomb empty. That is when they remember what Jesus had told them – that he would rise again. Easter Sunday is the most special day in the Church's year; it is the day that God fulfilled His new promise to us – His Son died so that we could have everlasting life

### Year of Prayer

In 2025 we celebrate a Jubilee Year of the Church. To prepare for this special occasion, Pope Francis has dedicated the year of 2024 to the Year of Prayer. Throughout the year, we will be sharing prayers with children, supporting them in prayer and teaching them ways to pray. We would love for you to share in this too. When we share the prayers of the month, say them as a family. Prayers can be simple and said at any time. Prayers can be to ask God for help, to thank God, to ask for forgiveness. They can be for ourselves, our friends, our family, people from around the world.

This year, we will share prayers with you each week that you can say as a family. This weeks' prayer is the Apostles Creed. In this prayer we profess our faith:

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into hell; on the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from there He will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit. the Holy Catholic Church, the communion of Saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body.
