


How can you help your child at home?

It is SO important to read the school readers with your child at home. We ask that you help your child with their reading daily and sign their reading diary each time.

- Practise spellings with your child at home. These are given out termly, it is important for your child to understand the spelling or phonetic rules and how they are applied to words.
- Encourage independence with weekly homework.
- Encourage your child to use numbers in everyday situations
 e.g. using pocket money to pay for sweets or treats,
 helping to measure out ingredients for a recipe etc.
- Encourage your child to count and develop an interest in numbers.
- Support your child to read, write and order numbers to 100, counting in 2's, 5's and 10's. Ensure correct number formation.
- Encourage your child to write their full name, and know their birthday and address.
- Support your child to complete any written work using the correct letter formation. Pay particular attention to presentation, to take pride in their work.
- Read books and visit the library together with your child to foster a love for reading.
