



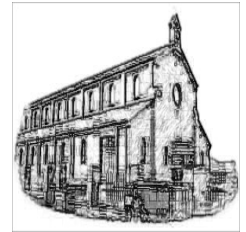

CAFOD: Response in Gaza: Your donations to Gaza
since the start of the conflict have been a vital lifeline.
Right now, CAFOD's partner, Caritas Jerusalem, is de-
livering essential medical treatment to displaced people
and providing medicines to treat chronic illnesses. We
have helped 1,400 households with cash to buy supplies
in the last month and we are currently feeding 2,000
people with new stocks of flour and rice. Despite the re-
strictions on aid coming into Gaza, CAFOD's local part-
ners are working tirelessly to help people. And with
