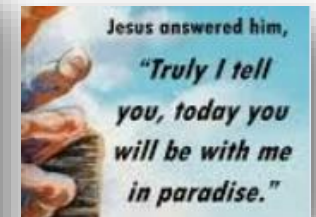


Spring 2026

Catholic Social Teaching



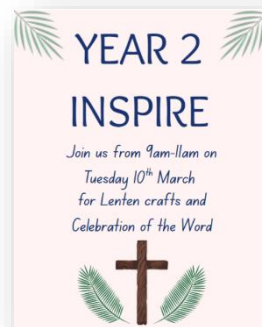

Thank you to all the parents and family members who joined us for our Inspire mornings over the last term. Our most recent ones focused on Lent and what this time give us the opportunity to do.



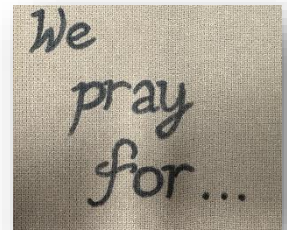
Catholic Life Pledges
